yupo'po

This facility houses both Onagawa Station and the hot spa Yupo'po. The building was designed by the world-renowned architect Shigeru Ban, and is particularly noted for its large roof, designed to resemble a seagull in flight. The new station building is situated about 200m further inland than the former station on ground that has been raised by 7-9m, and together with the promenade leading from the station to the sea, it is viewed as the new symbol of the town. Under the art direction of the artists Hiroshi Senju and Eiji Mito'oka, an inner wall of the building houses a work of tile art consisting of one of Mr Senju's pictures and over 900 depictions of flowers solicited from members of the public.



- **Open** : 9:00a.m. to 9:00p.m. (Last admission 8:30p.m.)
- **Closed** : The third Wednesday every month
- **Admission fees** : 500 yen for Adults, 300yen for Children

■ Onagawa Community Center

The concept of this facility is "A comfortable place to relax & chat – the town equivalent of your own living room". Residents and visitors drop in freely. This interactive facility, planned by taking local ideas, includes hall, studio, meeting room, kitchen, kids space, library, etc.

It includes a mini supermarket and a variety of interesting shops selling attractive locally produced goods and restaurants where visitors can sample the delicious produce of the area.

Local markets HamaTerrace



HamaTerrace is a tenant type tourism and production facility for local people and tourists. Those stores provide special local product, foods such as fresh seafood in season and sweets, the sale of organic soap as well as soap making workshops. It is adjacent to the brick road and also excellent in accessibility from Route398. It becomes an entrance facility for tourists. 8 stores with a basic concept of the "Ocean" are opened.



■ Onagawa Hands-On Fisheries Center Again Station

This facility was built on National Route 398 as a tourist and meeting place for the newly reconstructed Onagawa. It also keeps a connection to the past in its appearance, built to resemble the former Onagawa Station building that was destroyed by the tsunami. The Center is part of efforts to revitalize the fishing industry, and includes participatory fisheries events and branding efforts to enhance the image of Onagawa marine produce. Projects implemented here include "Again Kitchen," with hands-on fishing experiences and cooking, and "Again Plaza," a rest area selling local products.



■ Onagawa Future Center Camass

This is a new facility designed as an aid to revitalizing the community. It is a place where residents and people from outside the area can meet, exchange opinions and information, and come up with innovative ideas. Various events are held here, including "Future Session," a discussion workshop based on talking about the current issues faced by the town and what kind of future to work towards. It is now a popular meeting spot and includes meeting rooms and workspace areas, along with functions to support businesses and new ventures in the town.
